Q. After 2 under par today, 8 under yesterday, looking to be one back perhaps heading into the third round. On a day when the birdies aren't as plentiful as they were yesterday, how important are some of those par saves? Does it carry more weight?

WES ROACH: I think so, very much so. I looked at my caddie, Stuart, on 18 and kind of told him today was a big day for us kind of hanging in there. Definitely didn't have my best stuff tee to green, but was able to kind of hang in the tournament. It was huge to have some of those par saves on the back nine.

Q. What kind of attitude and goal will you take into the weekend?

WES ROACH: My number one goal for this season is to win, that's the only way to get any kind of job security out here on the PGA TOUR is to win, so that's number one.

Obviously just, you know, more focused on just, you know, executing and hitting good shots, making good swings and just kind of letting the big picture play into itself. Yeah, I mean, just going to try to keep making a bunch of birdies.

Q. When you're in contention like this with a goal to win and improve your status, because it's not bad status but not great, do things get a little more, I don't know, nerve wracking on a day-to-day basis?

WES ROACH: I think they can depending on how you look at things. It's a great opportunity for me to improve and to get better and to learn a little bit more about myself this weekend, so I look forward to the challenge and hopefully I'll be up to it.
