

BRENDON TODD (-15)

BRENDON TODD: I'm pleased, I'm not thrilled. I hit it pretty nice. I had 15 feet all day and didn't make many of them. The chip-in on 12 was a bonus.

Q. That was a great shot to have that go in for you there. I was going to mention the putting just seemed to be off a bit on the edges. Was that it?

BRENDON TODD: Exactly. These greens are grainy, they're a little bit slow, so you're always kind of guessing whether it's two balls or three balls, how hard to hit it. I think everybody's battling it a little bit, but it's also why the scores are low, it helps the ball stop close to the hole and you can ram a few in.

Q. You seemed pretty comfortable flighting the ball low and playing three-quarter shots. Seemed to be a lot of those out there on this golf course.

BRENDON TODD: There are, yeah. The winds are up today, 15 probably miles an hour, and we've always got to kind of control your flight to get the ball the right distance. I did a good job of that mostly, and then tomorrow the winds will die down a little bit, so we might be able to go low.

Q. How appreciative are you to be back in this position, a chance to win on the PGA TOUR? I know there's been some struggles over the years.

BRENDON TODD: Yeah, this is a huge opportunity for me and hopefully one of many this year. I'll just go out there tomorrow and make the best of it.
