But more for me, it's a process of understanding that I don't need to prove that I belong out here need to prove myself to myself. As I'm out there, if I need to prove that I can hit certain shots, oh, that's what Tour players hit. I am a Tour player, I am on the PGA TOUR, I've earned the right to be here and I've earned the right to call myself a Tour player. So just believing in myself, trusting the work I've put in and just having fun.

Q. And then finally, just for a little love for the Bermuda Tourism Authority, just being here this week, obviously a first-year event, how special a place has this been for you?

HANK LEBIODA: It's sweet, it's really cool. I was blown away by how nice everything was here and how well the tournament was run. Hopefully, next year I'll play in Shanghai in the WGC, but otherwise I would be very happy to come back and compete for the Bermuda people.

HANK LEBIODA: Thankfully, with that top-10, I'll be playing in Mayakoba. I was outside the number. Hopefully Mayakoba and Seattle and that will be the end of the year for me.
