Q. Two fist pumps, the one at 15, you made that par there, and then the long birdie at 16, and then a 360 lip-out at 17?

AARON WISE: Yeah, it all means a lot. Like I said, it was just so fun to have shots that were that important again. Yeah, 17, the way I finished, I hit three perfect putts there and wasn't able to make any of them. It's a little bittersweet, but man, I'm just looking at the whole week and excited I played well and excited the way I played today with a lot of pressure on me.

Q. You came into the week saying you're trying to get back to where you were game-wise from just a couple of seasons ago. How close are you now?

AARON WISE: Really close. I thought I had an amazing week. Those little breaks that kind of go your way that seem to happen when you win didn't happen for me this week, but overall, I played incredibly solid. It was one of my best ball-striking weeks with my irons I've had as a pro, and for me to be able to do that, I'm always going to be up near the top of the leaderboard. So hopefully I can keep that rolling, keep that going and I've still got two more events left this year and try to do my best there.
