Camilo Villegas (Winner/-24)

- Earns his fifth career PGA TOUR victory in his 388th start at the age 41 years, 10 months, 5 days
- First victory since the 2014 Wyndham Championship, snapping a winless drought of 9 years, 2 months, 26 days (or 3,374 days)

- **PGA TOUR wins (5):** 2008 BMW Championship, 2008 TOUR Championship, 2010 Classic in The Palm Beaches, 2014 Wyndham Championship, 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship
- Third winner in their 40's to win on TOUR this season (Justin Rose/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, Lucas Glover/Wyndham Championship and FedEx St. Jude Championship)
- Following his runner-up finish at 2023 World Wide Technology Championship, becomes first player since J.T. Poston in 2022 to finish runner-up and win the following week (T2/Travelers Championship, Won/John Deere Classic)
- Second player from Colombia to win on TOUR this season, joining Nico Echavarria (Puerto Rico Open)
- Becomes third-consecutive international winner of the event (Lucas Herbert/Australia/2021, Seamus Power/Ireland/2022)
- 260 (-24) ties the 72-hole tournament scoring record (Brendon Todd/2019)
- Wins in his fourth start in the Butterfield Bermuda Championship (T55/2020, T34/2021, T54/2022, Won/2023)
- Collects 500 points and moves from No. 147 to No. 75 in the FedExCup standings; entered last week's World Wide Technology Championship at No. 223 in the FedExCup standings with 13.661 FedExCup points on the season
- Moves to No. 162 in the Official World Golf Ranking (entered week No. 318); marks the lowest-ranked player to win on TOUR since Nico Echavarria (No. 406) at the 2023 Puerto Rico Open

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The top 125 in the FedExCup Fall standings thru The RSM Classic will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS Championship next season
- Nos. 51-60 in the standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will qualify for two Signature Events in 2024 via The Next 10 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
- Players currently projected to move into the top 125: **Camilo Villegas** (No. 147 to No. 75), **Matti Schmid** (No. 148 to No. 120), **Carl Yuan** (No. 134 to No. 125)
- Players currently projected to move out of the top 125: **Henrik Norlander** (No. 121 to No. 126), **Maverick McNealy** (No. 124 to No. 127), **C.T. Pan** (No. 125 to No. 129)
- Player currently projected to move into The Next 10: **Luke List** (No. 61 to No. 58)

Additional Player Notes

- Six players at T5 or better represent six different countries (Colombia, Sweden, Germany, China, Australia, United States)
- In bid to becoming the 13th first-time winner on TOUR this season and first wire-to-wire winner in tournament history, **Alex Noren** (2nd/-22) earns his third runner-up finish on TOUR in his 162nd start (P2/2018 Farmers Insurance Open, 2nd/2022 Barracuda Championship, 2nd/2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- Germany's **Matti Schmid** (3rd/-21) earns his career-best finish in his 35th start (previous: T6/2023 American Express); began the week at No. 148 in the FedExCup Fall Standings and is projected to move to No. 120
- 14-time PGA TOUR winner **Adam Scott** (T5/-19) earns his fifth top-10 finish of the season in his tournament debut
- With a T5, **Ryan Moore** earns best finish since the 2021 John Deere Classic (T2) and moves from 140 to No. 128 in the FedExCup standings
