

**ROUND 2 QUICK QUOTES**  
**November 15, 2024**

**RYAN MOORE (-10)**



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**Q. Ryan, in with a 65 to follow a 67 yesterday. How do those two rounds compare?**

**RYAN MOORE:** A little different. Swing felt good, both of them. I felt like I really controlled the ball nicely yesterday especially with a lot more wind. Today was maybe a little loose with the irons, or sorry, with the driving at times and a couple long irons, but wedges were great, really good control there and control the distance and gave myself good opportunities for birdie throughout most of the day really. So in the end pretty similar rounds but kind of different ways of getting there.

**Q. How different was it to play, like still windy but without as much wind?**

**RYAN MOORE:** Yeah, today was very calm. They certainly didn't have much in the morning and we really didn't until our 16, 17th hole of the day it just kind of picked up and then it kind of died again back on our 18th hole of the day.

It was kind of nice when you have the weather that we've kind of had these two days and everyone kind of has to play in the same thing, it's nice to see. Sometimes it can be one side plays in the wind and the other doesn't and you can see such a disparity in score. So far it's been really consistent both ways for the most part and I think that's great.

**Q. There's a lot of similarities this year as last year coming into this event for you, outside the 140 in the FedExCup and two events to go. What's sort of mindset did you bring knowing that you finished top-5 here last year?**

**RYAN MOORE:** I mean, not much of one, to be honest. It's hard to feel super confident playing the golf I've been playing, but it hasn't been bad golf, it's just not good golf. You know, when you're doing that, at least you know you're maybe one little thing away from firing off some good rounds. It's not like I've been struggling with everything, it's just nothing's quite working how I want it to.

I've been trying to be patient with it. Like I said in the interview outside, I've got to get out of this habit of remembering how to play golf this second to last week of the year, that's not a good habit to be in out here. But I hope it continues over the weekend and my game keeps kind of trending the way it's been. I know the conditions are going to be pretty tough playing in a lot of wind and we kind of got to see what that's like yesterday, so hopefully I'm prepared and ready to go do it.

**Q. You mentioned struggling trying to learn to play golf again. What have you seen these last two days that you hadn't seen for the rest of the season?**



**RYAN MOORE:** I would say a little consistency in the swing of just kind of felt pretty much the same both days. I feel like I kind of get lost or lose a feel or this and that. I feel the last two days everything has felt pretty consistent. And then the reality is just making more putts. I mean, that's really what it's been all year long. There's days where it kind of gets working, but one day it's good, the next day not good. So for me, I made a maybe 25-or 30-footer on my first nine of the day on the par 3 there and then I made another one from about 40 or 50 feet on the back nine today. Really made all the shorter putts I should make. When I did hit it into six, eight feet, I converted those. You know, doing that, I think tee to green, if you look at my stats, I've been doing just fine the last couple seasons, it's just converting when I do hit some good shots, kind of missing some of those and those are momentum. It's missing a par saver or birdie putt when you're doing good stuff and just kind of kills your momentum. So it's been nice to see those go in.

**Q. Ryan, typically you're one of the more accurate guys off the tee on the Tour. You said it was a little off today, but Sam mentioned that accuracy off the tee for him helped him shoot a low round in the morning. How much of a premium is put on driving accuracy on this golf course?**

**RYAN MOORE:** I mean, it definitely helps. It's pretty narrow, there's not a ton of space, there's a handful of really tough tee shots out there. So just being in play, and even just maybe not being in the fairway but not having big misses, right, around this golf course. If you're missing it four, five, maybe 10 yards offline it's not too bad as long as you're favoring the proper side. If you start missing it 20 yards offline here, you can get it in trouble really quick. For me, it's controlling that ball and keeping the misses at least in reasonable places to be able to play. The greens are receptive enough that it's not ideal being in the rough, but you still have a chance to knock it on the green and have a reasonable putt, but it's always better being in the fairway.
